Frequently Asked Questions for First time Campers

What should my camper bring with them to camp?

Your camper should have a bag with them for the day. Remember to include a water bottle, bathing suit and towel, snack, lunch, change of clothes, and some sunscreen/ bug spray. We also have a snack bar with snacks and drinks for purchase during lunch.

Can a camper bring their own electronics, toys, or activities?

In order to prevent loss or damage, we ask that all personal toys, activities, and electronics are left at home during the camp day.

What is the procedure for pick up and drop off?

The first day of camp each session we ask that you escort your camper into the building. This is when you will find out which group they are in and where you can find them at pick up. Tuesday thru Friday you can take advantage of our valet service between 8:45 am and 9:00 am. Our staff members will be outside to assist your camper out of the car and into the building.

During dismissal, which is between 3:15 pm and 3:30 pm, campers can be signed out at their tables by anyone on the authorized pick up list who shows the counselor a photo I.D.

My camper needs to have medication at camp. What is the policy for this?

All medications will be collected by the Healthcare Supervisor at the beginning of each session and stored in a secure location in the office. All medications must be in the original package and have the campers name on them.



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My camper needs to be reminded to put sunscreen/bug spray on. Who can do that?

Our Healthcare Supervisor can apply sunscreen/bug spray or remind your camper to put it on during the day. We treat sunscreen and bug spray as a medication, please see above for procedure.

My camper does not know how to swim. What happens when they go to pool?

At InspireWorks our goal is to have all campers participate in our swim lessons, regardless of their swim ability. Our counselors work very closely with campers to make sure that they feel safe and comfortable in the water. During the lesson portion of the swimming block we encourage campers to participate without the use of a life jacket or swim bubbles. This allows them to fully experience the water and provides the opportunity to practice skills such as floating. During the free swim portion of the block swimmers can use their own life jacket if it makes them feel more comfortable.

Are you peanut free?

Although our facility is not peanut free, we do have a peanut free location in the cafeteria where campers can eat snacks and lunch. Allergies are also shared with the cooking specialist to ensure a safe experience during the cooking block.

Can I adjust the Authorized Pick-up list?

If you would like to make changes to the authorized pick up list, a signed note from a parent/guardian must be provided before a camper can be dismissed.

Is there a fridge or microwave available?

We do not have a fridge or microwave available for camper use. Please plan all snacks and lunches accordingly.

What happens when it rains or there is a thunderstorm?

When it rains during a camp day, campers still go outside for their regular activities. We ask that they change into their bathing suits as well as bring a change of clothes for the day. If there is a thunderstorm all campers are brought inside the building for alternate activities.
